WHAT IS THE NEED?

Baptist Global Response (BGR) cares about people and wants to connect people who care with people in need! Through The Bucket Project: Hospice Kits, BGR has involved churches, groups and individuals all over the U.S. in meeting the critical needs of people overseas who are in the last stages of terminal illness. Southern Baptist churches have already helped BGR send over 5,000 of these “buckets of love” to countries like Swaziland, Lesotho, Mozambique and South Africa where HIV/AIDS is crippling populations, and in many cases, wiping out communities. In addition to the HIV/AIDS pandemic, thousands in Sub-Saharan Africa die each year from sicknesses like cancer, tuberculosis, malaria and other devastating diseases. For most, the only care they will receive is at home.



WHAT IS THE BUCKET FOR?

The BGR Hospice Kit is a collection of medical/hygiene supplies placed in a 5-gallon, heavy-duty plastic bucket with a sealable lid that will provide assistance to caregivers and quality of life to homebound, terminally ill patients. Kit items will make the caregivers' tasks much easier; but more importantly, will ease the suffering of the ones affected by the illness.
